SUGGESTED CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL FOR NEW CLUB CUP

- 1. Club shall use steel shot for all future shooting until the shot fall zone is cleaned up to normal lead background levels and Wisconsin RCL levels for PAH contamination.
- 2. The Club shall use non-toxic clay pigeons that do not contain coal tar or pitch
- 3. The Club shall follow the Best Management Practices for Shooting Ranges as recommended by the Environmental Protection Agency.
- 4. The Club shall produce a written plan approved by the Town to clean up the shot fall site from lead and PAH contamination within 3 months of receiving a Conditional Use Permit from the Town.
- 5. The Club shall take steps to remediate the site from lead and PAH contamination to levels outlined in item 1 above within 12 months of receiving a Conditional Use Permit.
- 6. When the Club has remediated the shot fall zone of lead and PAH contamination it may request permission to use lead shot for shooting from the Town Board.
- 7. The Club shall perform comprehensive lead and PAH testing on the shot fall site every year until the contamination from lead and PAH is cleaned up to safe levels.
- 8. Upon the written request of nearby landowners, the Club shall perform surface and groundwater testing for lead and PAH contamination.
- 9. The Town will re-evaluate annually any approved C.U.P. for the first three years.
- 10. The Club shall report a "spill" to the DNR as suggested by the UW Extension Agent Soils Report.

SHOOTING DAYS

- 11. The Club may shoot up to 3 hours per day on Thursdays and Saturdays with exemptions for Thanksgiving week and Christmas.
- 12. The maximum number of shooters on Thursdays and Saturdays shall be 30 per day. Each shooter shall shoot a maximum of 50 rounds. The maximum number of shots in any given Thursday or Saturday shall never exceed 1500.

- 13. Hunter Safety Days need to take place during approved hours and days.
- 14. The Club shall keep records of how many shots were fired per day.

NON-SHOOTING DAYS

- 15. **Events are defined as** any use of the property, including club members or third parties.
- 16. The Club shall have up to 12 non-shooting weekend events no more than one per month 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. Events shall not be held on successive weekends.
- 17. The Club can hold 2 weekday 3-hour events between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.
- 18. The Club can hold 1 monthly 3-hour board meeting between the hours of 9am- 9pm, to be held on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.
- 19. No more than 131 vehicles parked for any event, configured so that emergency vehicles can pass through and driveways are accessible.
- 20. No more than 250 people on the property at any one time.
- 21. Archery events are included in total number of allotted weekend and weekday events.
- 22. All activities are to be posted on the club's website 30 days prior to event so neighbors can plan.
